## Grand Traverse County Commission on Aging 2020 Program Statistics



The Grand Traverse County Commission on Aging provides in-home services to resident senior citizens who are 60 years of age or older. Providing services safely for clients and staff is always a major focus of the COA, but was particularly challenging during the COVID-19 pandemic. The COA continued to provide all services throughout the entire year, except during March, April and May of 2020 when COA housecleaning services were put on hold for a 14-week time period. Below is information on services provided by the Commission on Aging during 2020 and the COVID-19 pandemic.

- Unduplicated number of clients seen = 1,743
- · Number of visits to clients
  - Home Health Care = 5,199
  - Respite Care = 890
  - Housecleaning = 10,134
  - In Home Foot Care = 1,335
  - Outdoor Services = 8,818
- · Number of clients receiving services, by program
  - Home Health Care = 148
  - Respite Care = 44
  - $\circ$  Housecleaning = 606
  - Medication Management = 62
  - In Home Foot Care = 383
  - Foot Care Clinics = 71
  - PERS = 804 (Personal Emergency Response Systems/Alert buttons)
  - Outdoor Services = 696 unduplicated clients
    - Lawn/Leaf Service = 425
    - Snow Removal Service = 401
    - Window Washing Service = 262
    - Miscellaneous Odd Jobs & Grab Bar Installations = 58
- During the 14-week shut down of Housecleaning services, Housecleaning staff made phone calls to isolated seniors and provided grocery shopping services for seniors who were not able to shop for themselves.
  - Number of calls made to area seniors by COA staff = over 14,000 calls, averaging 1,000 calls per week
  - Number of grocery shopping visits = 126
- · COA supplied cloth masks to any seniors who requested them
- Baskets of Bounty program = 146 clients received these baskets during the holidays which contained non-perishable food items, toiletries, paper products and miscellaneous gifts.
